

## Carlotta Arch Track

(Wiradjuri & Gundungurra Country)

🏃 25 min to 30 min









From Caves House, this short but relatively steep trail goes up to Carlotta Arch, enjoying fantastic views out over Blue Lake, the Jenolan Valley and River. Back at Caves House, you can enjoy a cup of coffee or a milkshake in the bistro. For those in Jenolan primarily do a caves tour, this is a great walk to add a little bit of variety to your day. Let us begin by acknowledging the Wiradjuri & Gundungurra people, Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.





Class 3 of 6 Formed track, with some branches and other obstacles	
Quality of track	Smooth and hardened path (1/6)
Gradient	Short steep hills (3/6)
Signage	Clearly signposted (1/6)
Infrastructure	Generally useful facilities (such as fenced cliffs and seats) (1/6)
Experience Required	No experience required (1/6)
Weather	Weather generally has little impact on safety (1/6)

Getting to the start: From , Kyewong.

- Turn on to Jenolan Caves Road, 1 then drive for 19.7 km
- Keep left onto Jenolan Caves Road and drive for another 305 m
- Continue onto Jenolan Caves Road, 1 and drive for another 26 km





## Before you start any journey ensure you;

If not, change plans and stay safe. It is okay to delay and ask people for help.










**Getting started:** From the opposite side of the Jenolan Caves Road from Caves House, this walk follows the 'Six Foot Track' sign up the concrete steps. The walk then follows the stone footpath up the side of the valley for about 80m to pass the 'Southside Show Caves' information sign then just over 30m later to the 'Grand Arch' information sign (and view of the Arch). The walk continues fairly gently up the path for 100m (as it bends right) to find 'Caves House' information sign. The path soon starts leading much more steeply up as it begins to Zig Zag up past a seat and more views down to caves house for 150m beside the limestone cliffs. At the top of this climb the path leads over a small small rise then gently down to a fenced lookout beside 'Carlotta Arch'.

At the intersection of Six Foot Track & Jenolan Caves Road **Start** heading along Six Foot Track (a footpath).







After another 20 m come to the cave.

Then head through the tunnel (about 35 m long)

Then head through/around the gate.



After another 10 m come to the cave.



Then head down the steps (about 50 m long)



The bridge spanning out from the Grand Arch was designed by Mr Ernest M. De Burgh, and built by the Public Works Department in 1896. The bridge allowed greater access to the caves and was built from locally cut limestone. About 65 m past the end is "Blue Lake".



Blue Lake, or Lake Jenolan, is a small lake on the eastern side of the Grand Arch. The lake is fed by the River Styx and the Jenolan River. Blue Lake's intense colour comes from the refraction of light through limestone sediments.

About 75 m past the end is "Lucas Cave".



Turn around here and retrace the main route for 520 m to get back to the start.
